

It certainly was an unexpected and dramatic finish to his presentation. Light refreshments were served and enjoyed as the audience waited out a severe thunderstorm.

At long last, on June 11, there was a Celebration at the restored Rehoboth Railroad Station and a fitting dedication ceremony which was addressed by Governor Mike Castle. Mayor Vought accepted the key to the station from the donor of the building, Dominick Pulieri of Grotto Pizza, who was accompanied by the Project Manager Bob Salin and General Contractor Ronald Moore. M.C.'s for the affair were Evelyn Thoroughgood for The RBHA and Robert Moore for the Chamber of Commerce, co-chairmen of the Rehoboth Railroad Station Preservation Society. The Rehoboth Beach-Dewey Beach Chamber of Commerce hosted an Open House following the program for which local restaurants provided a delicious variety of their specialties. It was a beautiful day in every way. However, the old -- now restored -- station is still in need of funds to continue some necessary work. During the program a well-earned tribute was paid to Admiral Fabrizio by Robert Moore noted "Breezy's" role in the first efforts to lay the ground work for saving the station.

Another dedication of interest in June took place at the newly constructed TOT LOT on the shore of Lake Gerar behind the Henlopen Condominiums. This was a special project of Mayor Vought, carried out with the assistance of the Park Commission, chaired by Priscilla Smith and Gregg Ferrese, City Manager. After the ribbon cutting, the lot was opened and refreshments were served to over fifty per-school children. Take time to visit the TOT LOT. It's worth a trip!

On a sad note, the death of former Board of Directors member, Harry Voskamp, was announced. Mr. Voskamp was a dedicated worker for the cause of the RBHA for many years. We offer our sincere condolences to his family and many friends.
